July 18, 2016

Mayor Chatterton opened meeting at 7pm.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Introduction of Guests – Lyle & Shirley Jantzi, Clarence Sheley, Bonnie Kellogg, David Belloff, Charlie Briggs, Kelly & Nancy Spinner

Trustee Alicea moved to approve the minutes of 6/20/16 as presented, seconded by Trustee Perry. Vote: 4 ayes, 2 absent.

Trustee Perry moved to approve the financial reports as presented and year end budgetary transfers, seconded by Trustee Alicea. Vote: 4 ayes, 2 absent.

Trustee Murphy moved to approve the payment of bills on abstract #2 as presented, seconded by Trustee Alicea. Vote: 4 ayes, 2 absent.

David Belloff spoke to the board of work completed on the south side wall of his building on Main Street and is requesting payment to the contractor in the amount of \$5,000 which has been discussed and approved by the board in previous minutes. Trustee Perry approved for payment as discussed to be made to the contractor for the work completed, seconded by Trustee Singleton. Vote: 4 ayes, 2 absent. David thanked the board and left.

Bonny Kellogg and Clarence Sheley spoke to the board with their concerns of the proposed new sidewalk to be installed at his property on Hungerford Ave./Roberts St. He has trees in his front yard by the road side and is afraid of root damage being done which can hurt or destroy the trees. Also, he does not want to clear the sidewalks during the snow months. They won't improve the value of his property but he is mandated to have to maintain them and make repairs to them as necessary. They are both not in favor of having the sidewalks installed and will not sign the permit for them to be done.

Lyle & Shirley Jantzi shared their concerns of the proposed sidewalk on their property and they will not sign a permit for this work to be done, nor do they want the sidewalk to be cut through their newly paved driveway. They also will not clear the sidewalk and do not wish to have to maintain repairs to it.

Charlie Briggs spoke on the same subject for his property on N. Park St. and shares the exact same concerns and does not wish to have the sidewalk installed.

The board thanked them all for their comments and concerns and they all left.
